For your Baby

There are some basic ways you can help nurture your baby's religious life:

- Put a sacred image close to the crib such as an image of the Risen Christ or The Mother of God with the Child Jesus and point this image out to your child. The simplest and artistic representations are best. (For example, the works of Giotto or Fra Angelico are suitable for their solemnity and beauty of design.)
- Invite your child to watch and hear you when you perform sacred gestures, such as the sign of the cross when blessing your food. Bless yourself with the sign of the cross slowly and in silence; at other times give thanks to God praying in words.
- Bless your child with the sign of the cross after you have finished a moment in which you have been caring for your child's physical needs.
- Gather together for morning and evening times of prayer besides the baby's crib. Sing in a soft voice while nursing or feeding your child.
